

RESOLUTION ON WORLD CHILDRENS LABOUR

Conscious that there is still a long way to go for 47,5 million youth to enter the labour market legally around the world; but specially we have to take care for a 13% youth who do work in the so called "hazardous works".

The IDC-CDI:

- Condemns severely the obligation to work for under aged around the world, much of them in slavery conditions or forced to work, more than an 11% following the International Labour Organization (ILO) statistics.
- Condemns the global horrendous number of children casualties at work which rises annually to more than 22.000 children, thus a 6,5%.
- Calls to all governments to accomplish the Convention for children's rights of 2.000 specially regarding article 4 and following referred to promote the Convention and in particular on a mandatory and priority basis what if stated in art 32 "all states are obliged to protect the children for any dangerous work which can affect to health, to education or development; to fix minimum ages to access employment and to regulate the necessary conditions."
- Remembers the principles of the World Summit for the Children, September 30th, 1.990, where it was stated: "There is no cause with a higher priority than to Protect and Develop the Children from which survival, stability and progress of all nations depends and in fact all our civilization and the human being...".
