



Resolution on the support for the efforts of the International Commission for the Prosecution of Crimes against Humanity of the Castro Regime (Justice Cuba)

The Centrist Democrat International (IDC-CDI),

Whereas the "Justice Cuba" Commission, composed of lawyers, human rights activists and international political leaders, created the International Commission for the Prosecution of Crimes against Humanity of the Castro Regime in April 2017, with a view to exposing and prosecuting the systematic violations of human rights that have taken place since January 1, 1959, until now.

Whereas during the 60 years of the Castro Regime, over 30,000 people have died or are missing, most of them executed or murdered extrajudicially. Furthermore, approximately half a million people are estimated to have been imprisoned and/or tortured for purely ideological reasons.

Whereas the International Commission for the Prosecution of Crimes against Humanity of the Castro Regime, composed of international legal experts, is documenting, investigating and organising the data and evidence of these crimes in order to bring the Castro Regime human rights criminals before the courts.

Whereas the Commission is tasked with putting an end to the impunity of the regime and obtaining due justice for the victims, whose memory deserves and must be honoured and who merit compensation.

The Centrist Democrat International (IDC-CDI) agrees to:

- Support the work of the International Commission for the Prosecution of Crimes against Humanity of the Castro Regime in order to bring the state criminals responsible for human rights violations in Cuba to justice.
- Support the initiative aimed at setting up an ad hoc International Court of Justice, within the inter-American framework, to investigate, prosecute and punish those responsible for crimes against humanity in Cuba and prevent human dignity violations from going unpunished.
