

Resolution on the terrorist attacks in Africa

Two countries in Africa have been hit hard by terrorism in recent weeks: Somalia and Burkina Faso. In these two extremely violent and serious attacks, in which more than 170 victims were killed indiscriminately and over 180 suffered injuries of varying severity, a large number of women and children lost their lives.

Terrorism has become the most damaging and destabilising activity on the African continent, with all citizens becoming the main target of terrorist attacks.

The aim of these indiscriminate attacks is to weaken society in general, and institutions in particular, with the sole purpose of introducing the radical Islam they preach in order to achieve the subservience of institutions, subjecting individuals to a kind of slavery, and guaranteeing a source of illicit economic enrichment for these terrorist groups.

- 1.- Vigorously condemns these indiscriminate killings and declares that no economic, religious or political interest justifies any act of terrorism against innocent citizens.
- 2.- Reiterates our support for the victims and their families, since they are the ones who will suffer the pain and loss of their loved ones for generations to come.
- 3.- Sends a message of condolence and solidarity to the people of Burkina Faso and Somalia.
